While we create an initiative, that has been thought and reflected on, but that also comes from the depth of our hearts, to help our equals to live a better life, we face every day the hard realities of life, and the hardest of them all is rendering it a lasting one.

I will always remember of that classroom we opened in Burkina Faso to allow children to learn how to read and write. The teacher that had made the decision of consecrating a whole year of her life for these children had to drop the towel after six months. We had to tell the children that we couldn't keep going with the education. For me, this was worse than not opening the classroom at all, because we had given these children hope.

Thus, before creating anything, it's necessary to ask ourselves consciously: am i capable of making evolve what we are building? When and how am I going to be able to to pass the torch?

Creating an association like HAMAP-Humanitaire requires, on one side the will to budget what we think we can budget for, and it requires having enough humility to get help where we feel we have weaknesses and, as Marcus-Aurelius said, having enough wisdom to discern one from the other.

Passing the torch doesn't mean we get rid of a task that has become heavy to ask someone else to carry the torch. Passing the torch entails training, giving support and creating confidence!

Training a team from the beginning with a feeling of belonging is a great adventure, like a ship that is head towards a common goal. The goal is not to please oneself, or to nurture one's ego, but to train the partners so they can carry out their project. We had a long talk about this in our last MAG.

These training goes side by side with the support. Choosing one's successor means we have to support them and by no means leave them alone on command. It means we have to answer their questions, and comfort them regarding their choice, and reassure them or warn them about the obstacles found.

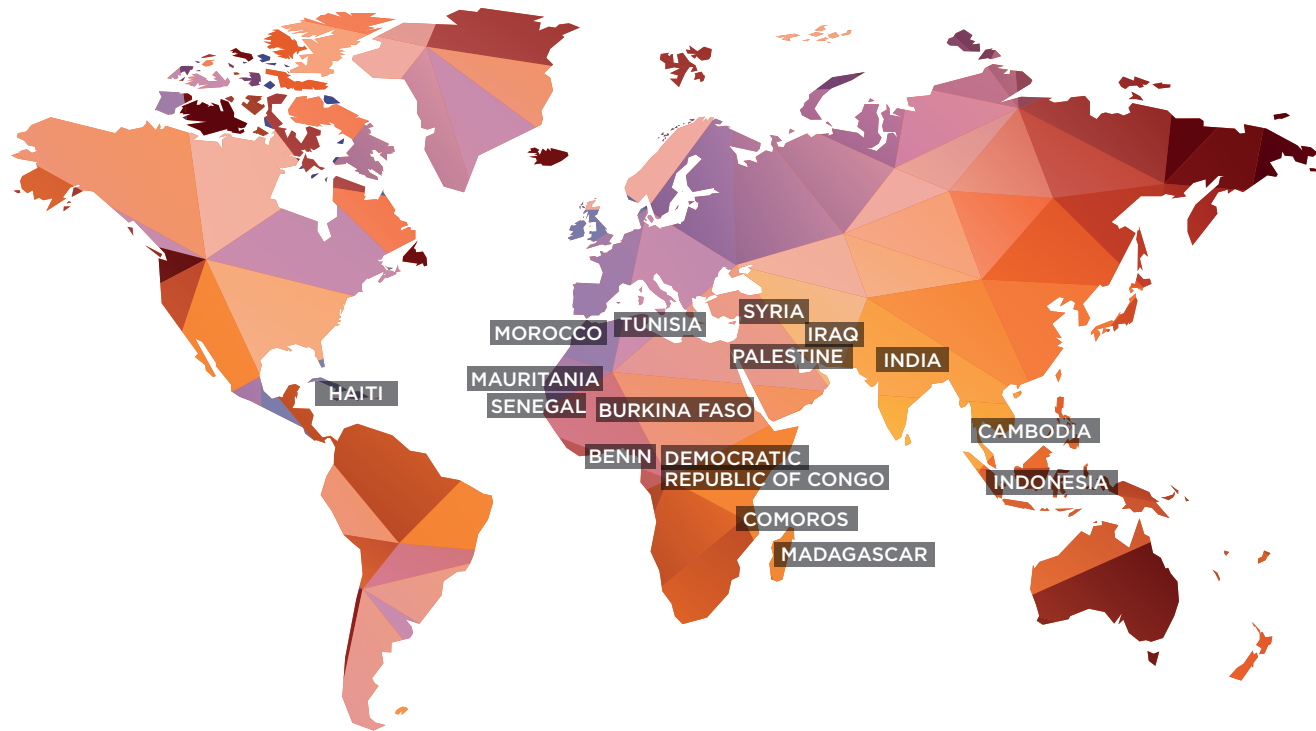
Finally, passing the torch means accepting relying on the new direction taken by the successor.

In 2021, our actions in 16 countries allowed us to support more than 300.000 People

Created in 1999, HAMAP-Humanitaire is a Non-Governmental Organisation (NGO) of international solidarity. The actions of HAMAP- Humanitaire are organised around four areas: access to water and sanitation, mines actions, education and healthcare.



Our commitment

HAMAP-Humanitaire has the purpose of supporting local partners from the moment of their first formulation of needs until the implementation of their project and its perpetration. Through this process, local actors consolidate their skills.

Our vision

Taking actions so more people can access drinking water and sanitation, education, healthcare and security. The actions of HAMAP-Humanitaire are always in favour of the most deprived populations, without distinction of origin, nationality, religion or social condition.

This year our action made possible that:

- 197,468** people had access to drinking water
- 96,670** people had access to sanitation
- 6,218** people had the benefit of access to education
- 30,400** people had the benefit of mine removal interventions
- 9,000** people participated in the workshops to raise awareness about mines' risks
- 1,500** people had access to medical care

HAMAP-Humanitaire intervened in two different ways:

GIVING SUPPORT TO FRENCH COLLECTIVES WHILE THEY CARRIED OUT A DECENTRALISED COOPERATION:

A decentralised cooperation consists in a partnership between a French territorial collective and a foreign collective, where their framework is formalised by a convention that defines the perimeters and the modalities of intervention (technical, organisational, financial...)

Subsequent laws, such as the Oudin Santini of the 9th of February, 2005, regarding international cooperation of local collectives and the water agencies, established innovative financing, with the possibility of consecrating up to 1% of the resources affected to water and sanitation to deliver actions of decentralised cooperation. The use of this instrument was then extended to the energy sector ("Pintat" Amendment) along with household waste management.

Throughout the decentralised cooperation, the NGO HAMAP-Humanitaire intervenes, from the moment of set-up of the projects, while assisting the project owner alongside the collectives, in a role of support, advice and coordination.

SUPPORTING LOCAL ASSOCIATIONS IN THEIR COUNTRY OF INTERVENTION:

HAMAP-Humanitaire also supports local associations during the implementation of their development projects.

The local association requests the support of HAMAP-Humanitaire with a project that is somehow accomplished. Our role is then to assist in the implementation of the project. This is done through technical support for the setting up of the project, the search for financing but also the consolidation of local skills.

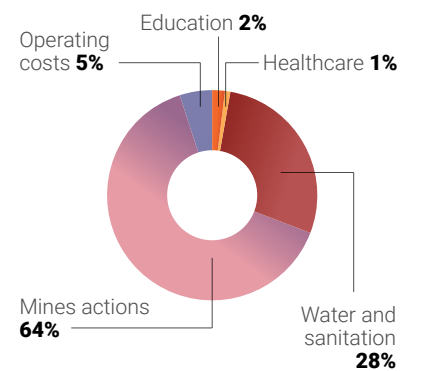

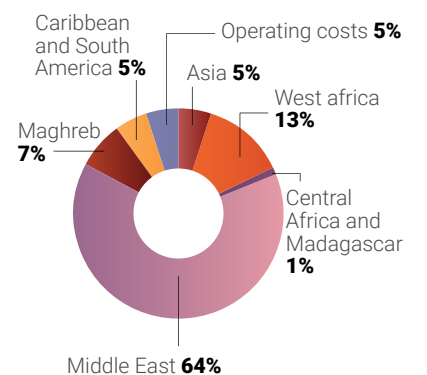
