Once again, I am proud as Chairman to be part of such excellent work to help women and children in more than 20 countries. The figures speak for themselves: 127,758 people have been granted access to water, 20,226 to sanitation, 2,764 to education and professional training, 11,988 to medical consultations, and 36 people have received training about risks related to improvised explosive devices.

Such achievements and results are thanks to the 150 executive volunteers, seniors executives, engineers and experts at HAMAP-Humanitaire as well as all of our employees and interns who have chosen to put their skills to good use for the benefit of the most disadvantaged people, particularly women and children.

This year, we achieved particularly good results both in terms of the projects implemented and the number of people we have been able to help as well as financially. Indeed, thanks to your help and support, HAMAP-Humanitaire now has a solid financial basis. As such, next year, we will be able to provide much-needed help and support to even more women and children.

Over the past year, we were keen to develop areas of focus related to health and education at HAMAP-Humanitaire, with an increasing number of health missions being organised to enable women, children and men to benefit from medical consultations in places where some people have gone for almost ten years without seeing a doctor. Education plays a pivotal role in a country's development. As such, we are doing everything we can to work alongside our local partners and develop beneficial projects - and we count on your help to be able to support them. A great many children and particularly girls need our help in order to attend school and have a future.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank the Ecole Nationale Supérieure des Ingénieurs Militaires (ENSIM) which, year after year, makes its engineering students available to work on our projects providing access to water and sanitation in several countries. In 2017, 10 young students from the ENSIM did work placements with our NGO in Haiti, the Comoros, Togo, Cambodia and India.

Lastly, we are delighted to welcome two new members as part of skill-based sponsorship agreements from Orange and BNP Paribas who will support our teams from 2018 onwards.

Once again, I would like to thank our volunteers, staff, backers and sponsors for their unwavering dedication, commitment and hard work day in, day out, to promote the values we hold dear: honour, loyalty, devotion, integrity and fraternity.

I am counting on you all and I would like to thank you again for all your hard work.

IN 2017, our actions in 14 countries resulted in aide being provided to almost 162,000 people.



OUR ABSOLUTE BELIEF

We demand that all men, women and children be regarded with fraternity so that the human condition makes sense. It is the duty of everyone to help bridge the gap brought about as a result of chance.

OUR COMMITMENT

Set up in 1999, HAMAP-Humanitaire is a Non-Governmental Organisation (NGO) that advocates international solidarity. Its aim is to take effective action so that more men, women and children have access to drinking water and sanitation, education and professional training, health and safety (mine action).

OUR RESULTS

In 2017, we have provided:

127,758 people with access to drinking water,

20,226 people with access to sanitation,

2,764 people with access to education and/or professional training,

11,988 people with a basic medical consultation

36 people with access to training about the risks of anti-personnel mines.

OUR MISSIONS

The mission of HAMAP - Humanitaire is to provide assistance to the project manager. It consists in providing support to our local partners at all stages, from the moment they first express their requirements to the completion and sustainability of their projects. // Construction: building schools, healthcare structures, etc.

Education – Professional training

// Supporting and monitoring literacy centres and schools.

// Providing training to local education professionals regarding teaching methods and human rights.

// Setting up income-generating activities (solidarity shops, women's shelters, bicycle workshops, farm groups).

Health - Hygiene

// Supporting and training local healthcare professionals by organising regular medical missions (basic medical consultations).

// Raising awareness about best practices for food and body hygiene aimed at local people and particularly children.

// Providing first-aid training to local people.

// Support for women and children who have experienced trauma.

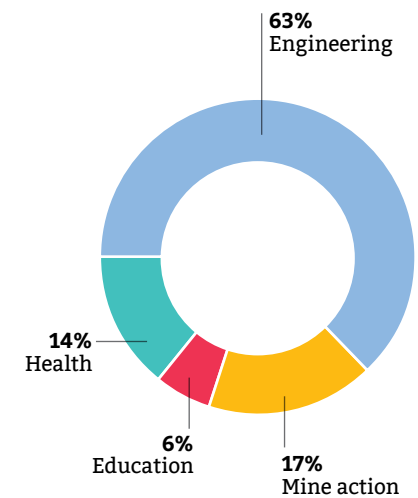

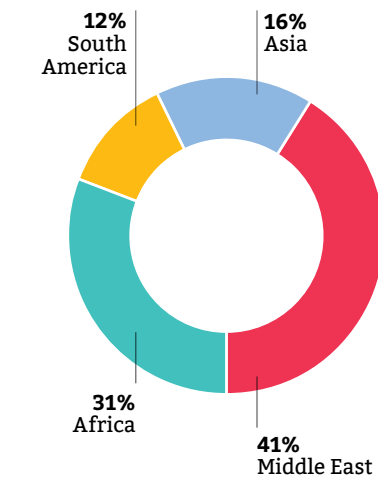

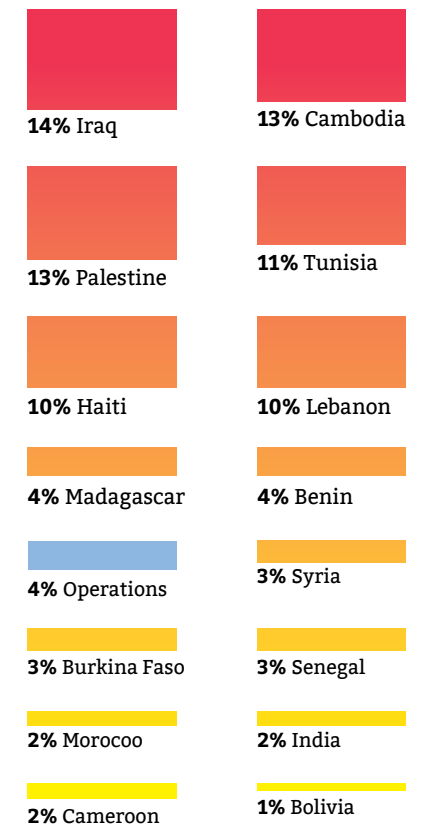
Use of resources by area of expertise

Description of activities. Building 70 water points (boreholes, pumps and coping). Providing structure maintenance training to local people. Raising awareness among villagers about hygiene and water usage.

HEALTH MISSIONS



The purpose of the health missions is to consolidate local capabilities by supporting local healthcare professionals, improving access to medical care to remote populations and to raise awareness about best

practices in terms of hygiene with a view to reducing the disease rates. These missions are represented by a multidisciplinary team comprising medical and non-medical volunteers who work with underprivileged local

people within dispensaries, schools and villager associations, for medical consultations, nursing care as well as a preventive dimension, with awareness-raising on hygiene.
